1. 1933-1934 ALASKA PASSENGER LIST on the Canadian Pacific Railway Company, sailing from Victoria June 9 and from Vancouver June 10 to Southeast Alaska ports. This small 8 page + cover “brochure” is a bit of Alaskan ephemera for the tourism collector.

Estimated value \$12.00

2. ALASKA TRANSFER CALENDAR from Juneau, Alaska, 1951. In near mint condition, this Juneau Company, phone #114, used the popular Boy Scouts of America picture done by Norman Rockwell on the calendar.

3. ALASKA: ITS NEGLECTED PAST, ITS BRILLIANT FUTURE by Bushrod Washington James, 1899. This appears to have a replica title page, but otherwise all original in very good condition. 444 pages about early Alaska with 42 chapters covering multiple subjects, and a bibliography of Alaskan literature published to date. This is an original first edition.

4. JOSEPHINE CRUMRINE dog menus, 7 total with 3 blank and unused (sold as souvenirs on the ship), 2 from the S.S. *Glacier Queen* operated by Alaska Cruise Lines, and 2 from the S.S. *Aleutian* in 1954. Crumrine did a total of 8 different dog portraits that were used from the 1930s into the 60s, mainly by Alaska Steamship Company and later by Alaska Cruise Lines.

5. ALASKAN AVIATION HISTORY 2 volume set published in 1990, by Robert W. Stevens. First volume covers 1897-1928; second 1929-1930...does that tell you how fast air transportation

took hold in the north in the early 1900s? These are in excellent shape with dust jackets. A must have for any Alaskan collector.

6. *Dictionary of Alaska Place Names* by Donald Orth, 1967. This is the first edition of the 1,084 page book that is a must have for any Alaskan. Weighs about a ton, and lists tens of thousands of Alaskan place names. There are 53 Moose Creeks! In excellent condition with the former owner’s name written inside.

7. COMPILATION OF THE ACTS OF CONGRESS AND TREATIES RELATING TO ALASKA FROM 3/30/1867 TO 3/3/1905 by Fred F. Barker, published in 1906. This is a rare original edition of this record of early Alaskan activities.

8. WHITE PASS & YUKON ROUTE brochure, 4” x 9” entitled Comments Alaska, Atlin and the Yukon. This 24-page book of letters on the railroad and trips taken probably was done around 1931, and includes a separate flyer with the 1931 trips and fares. Page 2 of the brochure is a letter from George Buchanan, who booked trips to Alaska called “On to Alaska With Buchanan” for youngsters. Good condition, with some pencil marks on it.

9. ALASKA STEAMSHIP COMPANY 1931 oversized brochure entitled “Sailing Sheltered Seas...to the Land of the Midnight Sun.” This has photographs or drawings on every page, and includes the Inside Passage and the Alaska Railroad trip to the interior. In good shape, but missing the map from the back.

10. INDIAN & ESKIMO ARTIFACTS OF NORTH AMERICA by Charles Miles, 1963. This oversized 244-page book has hundreds and hundreds of pictures of Native artifacts. A very thorough view of items hard to find today, from Alaska and throughout the U.S.

11. STERLING SILVER ALASKAN SPOON, 5½” in length, with a thin chain wrapped around the handle, and a gold pan marked “Alaska” and walrus at the top of the handle. Spoon is like new.

12. HERE AND THERE IN SOUTHEASTERN ALASKA by Trevor M. Davis, 1926. This 5½” x 7½” pamphlet/booklet is a pictorial view of Alaska sold originally by Butler-Mauro Drug Company in Juneau. In good condition for its upcoming 90th birthday, it contains photos from Skagway to Ketchikan.

13. FIVE ALASKAN POSTCARDS from the linen era. These show “An Alaskan Indian Cache” by Schallerer’s in Seward, an “Alaska Huskie” by Tichnor Quality Views, and 3 H.H.T. Co. views including “Juneau, Alaska” and Ketchikan and an Alaska Eagle. All are unused and in okay condition.

14. BIRDS OF ALASKA by Ira N. Gabrielson and Frederick C. Lincoln. This 1959 fantastic 922-page book on Alaskan birds is in good condition with a torn dust jacket. Published by the Stackpole Company in Pennsylvania, it claims to have taken 14 years of research to prepare.

15. ALASKA STEAMSHIP round brochure called “My Alaska Cruise.” This colorful bit of Alaskana is both text and pictures, in almost new condition. These were given to passengers on the different steamers to make notes on their trip and include a brief history of Alaska.

16. FIVE KOTZEBUE POSTCARDS, all real photo postcards with 4 taken by Frank Whaley, an early Alaskan senator, Wien pilot in 1933, bush pilot, gold miner, photographer and film producer. After he stopped flying in 1949 he worked for Wien as a photographer and a tour director. The Whaley postcards are The Huskies Take a Blow, Arctic Dance Drummers at Kotzebue, Miss Arctic Circle Beauty Contest, and an aerial of the Arctic village of Kotzebue. The 5th postcard by Johnston shows “Four Eskimo Natives with Sled Reindeer.”

17. KOBUK MAIDEN AND OTHER ALASKA SOURDOUGH VERSES by Elmer Reed, 1933, Juneau. This unique book of poetry contains “A Collection of Alaska Verses Compiled from Newspapers Published in the Territory from 1866 to 1933.” In good condition, this booklet has 34 pages of unique verse.

18. ALASKA STEAMSHIP COMPANY passenger list on the S.S. *Dorothy Alexander*, sailing from Seattle on July 30, 1937. This eight page list measures approximately 5” x 7” with the last page being autographs of passengers and crew obtained by the traveler. Pamphlet lists the passengers, where they are from, and where they are enroute to on this sailing. In good condition.

19. FIVE ALASKA REAL PHOTO POSTCARDS showing a Trapper's Cache; S.S. *Yukon*-Resurrection Bay-Seward, Alaska by the Alaska Shop in Seward; Fighting Moose Locked Horns-Death by Starvation by Griffin's Studio in Fairbanks; Providence Hospital, Anchorage by Robinson Photo; and the Westward Hotel, Anchorage by Robinson Photo. All are in good, unused condition.

20. MELVIN RICKS' ALASKA BIBLIOGRAPHY, An Introductory Guide to Alaskan Historical Literature, 1977, by Stephen Haycox. This is a must-have for any Alaskan historian or collector, listing countless books, articles and newspapers in and about Alaska. In very good condition.

21. ALASKAN SOUVENIR SPOON from Valdez. This is a demitasse spoon with a 3³/₄" totem handle. The bowl has a view of the long dock in early Valdez. The reverse of the handle says "Indian Totem Pole, Alaska" and is marked sterling.

22. KETCHIKAN ALASKA'S TOTEMLAND by Mary G. Balcom. This 1961 first edition shows some wear by way of bends, but overall in good condition. The work has been reprinted several times. Autographed by author to a friend.

23. SOUVENIR SPOON OF ALASKA 5 5/8" in length with plain bowl. Alaska and gold pan are on the handle, and the Seal of the Territory of Alaska is at the top of the handle. In excellent shape. This would be a great addition to a spoon collection.

24. PACIFIC STEAMSHIP COMPANY very unique luncheon menu. Dated September 17, 1929 this menu is on board the S.S. *Dorothy Alexander* enroute from Ketchikan to Seattle. It is the only one Candy Waugaman has ever seen in its format.

25. FOUR REAL PHOTO POSTCARDS showing an Alaska Reindeer, Eskimo Cutting Snow Blocks at Kotzebue, Totem of Chief Kian-Ketchikan, Alaska, and Memorial Rogers & Post Walikipaw, Alaska. All unused and in good condition.

26. CHILKOOT PASS AND SONGS OF ALASKA by Sylvester Kendrick, 1926. This small book of poetry is unique with a salutation in the front to the "Brothers of ninety-eight." Poetry covers Chilkoot Pass, Lake Bennett, White Horse Rapids, Nome, and other places.

27. YUKON GOLD NUGGET SPOON 5¹/₄" in length with "YUKON" inscribed in the bowl and a gold nugget at the tip of the handle. A great little item for a gift or to add to a collection, the spoon is sterling and the nugget is legit.

28. IVORY LETTER OPENER BY NUGURUK, approximately 5¹/₂" in length. This lovely ivory Alaskan item has a dog team with a sled and Native musher in a parka scrimshawed on the end. In excellent condition.

29. ALASKA STEAMSHIP BOWL, just under 6" x 4½" oval bowl made by Mayer China for the company. This is one of the hard-to-find pieces of china used for decades by the early transportation company in and out of Alaska. Bowl has a small dark spot that doesn't come out . . . don't know if it's a manufacturer's error or ????

30. SITKA BY THE SEA photograph by Case & Draper, approximately 8" x 10" with some bends at two corners. This picture was taken around 1906. It is a waterfront view of part of Sitka.

31. ARCTIC EXPLORATIONS by Elisha Kent Kane, reprint edition published in 1996. This book about "The Second Grinnell Expedition in Search of Sir John Franklin, 1853, 54, 55" is 447 pages. It is in new condition.

32. MODEL CAFÉ AND BAKERY, Cordova, Alaska. This glass framed outdoor picture is actually a calendar from 1942. The metal piece on the bottom pulls out to show each month. Used until April, this is in very good condition and has the wall hanger on the back.

33. ALASKA FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUB oversized book, a "Souvenir Edition 1924-26." This book has some wear to the cover but inside is in excellent condition. It has information on the 7 Women's Clubs in Alaska—Anchorage, Seward, Skagway, Juneau, Douglas Island, Kodiak, and Wrangell. There

are lists of officers, events, and some membership lists. It is 77 pages in length.

34. A BIBLIOGRAPHY OF ALASKAN LITERATURE by James Wickersham, 1927. This was the first publication of the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines, and printed by the *Cordova Daily Times*. Book has 635 pages of citations of books, articles, and documents relating to Alaska. It is in AS NEW condition.

35. SOURDOUGH JIM PITCHER, The Autobiography of a Pioneer Alaskan. This is a 64-page magazine that Alaska Northwest Publishing put out in 1985. It is about an early pioneer in the north.

36. SHELDON JACKSON SCHOOL brochure put out by the Women's Board of Home Mission of the Presbyterian Church, around 1925. The brochure unfolds and offers over a dozen photographs of the school. It was used to raise money for school operations.

37. CANADIAN NATIONAL STEAMSHIPS menu from 1945. This item shows some wear from two pieces of tape on the cover. The cover drawing for Alaska shows the "Indians at Ketchikan" drying fish. The meal sounds way too fancy to be served on the S.S. *Prince Rupert*, and would be pretty fancy is made these days!

38. ALONG ALASKA'S GREAT RIVER by Frederick Schwatka, reprint edition by Alaska Northwest Publishing, 1983. This magazine formatted publication seems more readable than the original book. It's an adventure filled read!

39. HAM RADIO or QSL CARDS from Alaskan locations, many military and Ketchikan cards. The ones that have been mailed are postmarked between the 1940s and 1970s. There are 15 unique cards.

40. ANNUAL SPRING FROLIC DANCE CARD put out by the military occupying the Alaska Railroad during World War II. The 714th Ry. Open Battalion put on the event, probably held at the Mt. McKinley Park Hotel March 18, 1944. In excellent shape.

41. SYDNEY LAURENCE 2016 calendar. New! This is a great item for a gift for a friend, and can be used instead of added to a collection!!

42. PACIFIC STEAMSHIP COMPANY Souvenir Passenger List from the July 8, 1925 sailing of the S.S. *Queen* to Alaska. Ports of call were Ketchikan, Wrangell, Petersburg, Juneau and Skagway on this 24-day trip that cost \$188.00. The passenger list folds so it could be mailed as a postcard. In very good condition.

43. FORGET-ME-NOT REBEKAH LODGE NO. 8 AND CORDOVA LODGE I.O.O.F. (Oddfellows) No. A-9 bowl. Marked semi-porcelain on the bottom. It was used by the

fraternal organizations. In good shape with no chips or cracks, this blue and white 5¼" bowl perhaps was used for dessert???

44. COPPER ALASKA BOOKENDS manufactured to promote the sale of Alaska copper. These have a pattern 209 under "Buy Alaska Copper" on the bottom of each, with "ALASKA" added on the outside in separate copper material. Unique!

45. CHINA DESSERT DISH showing picture of "Alaska Indian Bydarka" in the middle. It was commissioned as part of a series done "Compliments of the Valdez Bank & Mercantile Co., Valdez, Alaska" in 1909. This "made in Germany" dish is 7" in diameter and a great bit of advertising for the bank. Perhaps it was gifted to their depositors at Christmas. There is some fading in the subject wording, but otherwise in good condition.

46. BROWN & HAWKINS COOPERATION, Seward, Alaska shoehorn! Now how many of you participating in this auction have such a unique item? It is in great shape, probably put out for B & H by Red Wing Shoes whose logo is on it. This is something you can actually still use!

47. THE SPELL OF THE YUKON and other verses by Robert W. Service, dated 1907 but probably not a first edition as so many people think. Among the great poems are the Law of the Yukon, Land God Forgot, Heart of the Sourdough, Call of the Wild, Shooting of Dan McGrew, Cremation of Sam McGee, and of course the title poem.

48. ALASKA SPORTSMAN magazines from November and December 1950. The stories include the Mad Trappers of the Kantishna, Arctic Trap Line, Bears in the Alders, Moose Melees, and more. In good condition.

49. FIFTY YEARS IN ALASKA by Carl J. Lomen, in very good condition with dust jacket. Published in 1954, it tells Lomen's life in Nome and involvement in the Arctic from his arrival in 1900 for the next half-century.

50. MANY BATTLES: THE AUTOBIOGRAPHY OF ERNEST GRUENING, 1973. This 563-page tome is in great condition, with a little fading on the dust cover. Originally priced at \$12.95, this copy was bought at the Book Cache for \$2.25, but hopefully someone will pay more for it at the auction.

51. THE COPPER SPIKE by Lone E. Janson. Published in 1975, it profiled great photographs of the railroad, Cordova, and Kennecott copper mines. The paperback is in new condition.

52. ARCTIC WAR PLANES: ALASKA AVIATION OF WW II by Stephen E. Mills, 1971. The book has over 420 photographs. Hardcover, dust jacket, but a few pages are loose.

53. ALLIES IN WARTIME: THE ALASKA-SIBERIA AIRWAY DURING WORLD WAR II, edited by Alexander B.

Dolitsky, 2007. There are articles about the program and its legacy and lots of great photographs. Hardcover, new.

54. SPIRIT OF THE NORTH: THE ART OF EUSTACE PAUL ZIEGLER, by Kesler E. Woodward, 1998. Ziegler is perhaps Cordova's most famous artist, and this book has lots of his paintings in color. Hardcover, autographed, dust jacket, and in new condition.

55. UNDER THE NORTHERN LIGHTS, by Alice M. Guersney, 1917. The Women's Home Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church published this work. Paper, 121 pages, worn but in good condition.

56. PACIFIC AMERICAN FISHERIES, INC: HISTORY OF A WASHINGTON STATE SALMON PACKING COMPANY, 1890-1966, by August C. Radke, 2002. The company caught and canned salmon in Alaska from Southeast to Bristol Bay, as well as other places in Washington. Paperback, in great condition.

57. THROUGH ORTHODOX EYES: RUSSIAN MISSIONARY NARRATIVES OF TRAVELS TO THE DENA'INA AND AHTNA, 1850s-1930s, translated with an introduction by Andrei A. Znamenski, 2003. The volume has interesting and insightful accounts by six Orthodox clergy. Paperback, new.

58. BUILDINGS OF ALASKA, by Alison K. Hoagland, 1993. Although published more than 20 years ago, this is still the go-to book for folks in historic preservation. And it has been of interest to many travelers. Hardcover with dust jacket and in new condition.

59. 1956 SALMON PACKERS' REGISTER, 27th edition. The Public Fisherman published this book. Arranged alphabetically. A great reference source! Paper, 245 pages, good condition.

60. KROLL MAP OF ALASKA. The map folds up to fit in a purse of pocket. It has the name of a former owner on the cover, but the map itself is in excellent shape. The population for 1939 is given so assume that is around the date it was published.

61. EYAK LEGENS OF THE COPPER RIVER DELTA, ALASKA, compiled by John F.C. Johnson. This book was compiled in the 1970s and has great photographs. Paperback, 8½" x 11", 120 pages, and in new condition.

62. NORTH PACIFIC FISHERIES WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO ALASKA SALMON, by Homer E. Gregory and Kathleen Barnes, 1959. The book talks about conservation, economic factors, labor, marketing, prices, foreign trade, and still more topics. Hardcover.

63. ALASKA'S COPPER RIVER: THE 18TH AND 19TH CENTURIES, by William S. Hanable, 1982. This book is a

66. COPPER PLATE. Alan Faith worked for the *Cordova Times* newspaper from 1928-1931, and obtained this plate while there. It has a cache and word Alaska visible. The plate shows wear. Son Rogan recently took it to the appraisers who were at the Anchorage Museum and they said nice things about it and estimated its value.

69. TRAVEL AND ADVENTURE IN THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA, by Frederick Whymper. This is the 1966 reprint edition of a classic of Alaskana. Good book to understand Alaska in the 1860s as you prepare for the sesquicentennial of the Alaska purchase! Hardcover, new condition.

70. VINTAGE SOUVENIR PILLOW COVER showing a map of Alaska. Measures 18" x 18" and has yellow fringe.

71. CLOTH NAPKINS FROM TED STEVENS' SILVER ANNIVERSARY, DECEMBER 28, 1993. There are five of these blue napkins noting the occasion and including the Senate logo and date. They are new.

73. SPAWN OF THE NORTH, by Barrett Willoughby, 1932. This is one of the novels written by a one-time Cordova resident.

It's a page-turner! For someone taking the ferry home it would be a great read while on the boat! Hardcover, good condition.

74. TEWKESBURY'S WHO'S WHO IN ALASKA AND ALASKA BUSINESS INDEX, 1947. This is a great reference work for the researcher working on post-World War II Alaska. Along with everything else, it has "much information of a miscellaneous character". Hardcover, excellent condition.

75. ALASKA CHUM SALMON CHIEF BRAND, Alaska Packers Association, colorful 1 lb. salmon can label. The chiefs are wearing Plains Indian headdresses.

76. SALMON FROM KODIAK, An History of the Salmon Fishery of Kodiak Island, Alaska, by Patricia Roppel, 1986. This is the first edition with the sturdy paper cover and sewn pages. The book is once again out-of-print and in demand. This copy is in new condition.

77. FRIGID EMBRACE: POLITICS, ECONOMICS AND ENVIRONMENT IN ALASKA, by Stephen Haycox. For this work the Alaska Historical Society recognized the author as Historian of the Year. The author wrote a personal note to the former owner. Paperback, excellent condition.

78. A DANGEROUS IDEA: The Alaska Native Brotherhood and the Struggle for Indigenous Rights, by Peter Metcalfe with Kathy Kolkhorst Ruddy, 2014. Historians have wanted a history of the Southeast Alaska organization that played a critically

important role in working for the rights of Alaska's Native people. Paperback, new.

79. A GUIDE TO ALASKA BY MERLE COLBY, published in 1942, should be in every historian's library. The book was produced as part of the series for every state and territory done under the Federal Writers' Project, a New Deal program. The hardcover book is in good shape.

80. THE STORY OF SALMON no date, is a 24-booklet published by the Carlisle Packing Company of Seattle. The pages in the center have the company's different labels and are printed in color. There are also some great photographs in the text of places around the territory including Fort Yukon and Cordova. In very good condition.

81. PACIFIC SALMON FISHERIES by John N. Cobb, 1917. This is a bound copy of Cobb's report for the Bureau of Fisheries. Along with this report is an offprint about Cobb published in the *Marine Fisheries Review* in 2005. The book was discarded by the Seattle Public Library, but the report is complete and this is a great chance to get this vital reference.

82. THE ESKIMO PRINCESS by Sam Samson. This is a most curious little book with a totally misleading title.
